

# Guide to One-Event Racing Permits



## What is a One-Event Racing Permit?

A One-Event Racing Permit allows a rider to participate in an OCA event who does not hold a UCI licence or wants to register in a category excluded by Citizen Permits. One-Event Racing Permits are purchased at events and are not included in the entry fee. They are for entry level categories only. (M3 and S4 for road)

An organizer has the choice of selling One-Event Racing Permits at Citizen events. Instead of One-Event Racing Permits, the organizer may be selling Citizen Permits. Please contact your organizer to see if the event will be selling One-Event Racing Permits. At events that do not offer One-Event Racing Permits, riders will be able to purchase Citizen Permits.

One-Event Racing Permits will be sold at all Ontario Cup Events.

## How many One-Event Racing Permits can I buy?

XC and Road/CX riders are allowed to purchase 3 One-Event Racing Permits in a year TOTAL - regardless of discipline (i.e. Road, MTB XC, CX). After using your 3 permits, you must purchase a UCI licence or a Citizen Permit if applicable. Riders may only purchase 1 One-Event Racing Permit for a downhill event. After the one DH permit, DH riders must purchase a UCI licence. The OCA closely monitors the number of One-Event Racing Permits issued per rider.

At the present time, One-Event Permits are not allowed for BMX.

## How much does a One-Event Racing Permit cost?

- At Citizen events, One-Event Racing Permits have a cost of \$5 per event.
- At Regional events, One-Event Racing Permits have a cost of \$10 per event for riders 17 or over as of December 31, 2009.
- At Regional events, One-Event Racing Permits have a cost of \$5 per event for riders under the age of 17 as of December 31, 2009.

**This fee is not included in entry fees.**

### **Important Note for potential One-Event Racing Permit holders under the age of 18**

If you are under the age of 18 when purchasing a One-Event Racing Permit, you must have your parent or legal guardian help complete your permit form. If your parent or legal guardian can not be at the event to help you complete the form, an adult who is 18 years of age or older can complete the form with you. You must submit a letter from your parents at time of permit purchase, stating that they agree to let this person assume all legal risk for your participation.

### *Remember*

At Citizen events, One-Event Permits will be sold at the discretion of the organizer. Please contact your organizer for availability details.
